

DEEPER DIVE: Group 3 – Frontline Essential Workers (School and Child Care)

A tested, safe and effective vaccine will be available to all who want it, but supplies will be limited at first. To save lives and slow the spread of COVID-19, independent state and federal public health advisory committees recommend first protecting health care workers caring for patients with COVID-19, people who are at the highest risk of being hospitalized or dying and those at high risk of exposure to COVID-19. Our goal is to vaccinate as many people as possible given the limited supply of vaccines. Keep practicing the 3 Ws – wear a mask, wait six feet apart, wash your hands – until everyone has a chance to get vaccinated.

Group 3: Frontline Essential Workers: School and Child Care

NC will move to Group 3 Frontline Essential Workers on February 24. Because supply is still very limited and the population of frontline essential workers is so large, we will begin with anyone working in child care or in PreK – 12 schools starting on February 24th. North Carolina plans to move to additional frontline essential workers on March 10th. Some vaccine providers may not be ready to open to frontline essential workers on these dates if they are still experiencing high demand for vaccines in Groups 1 and 2.

Am I Eligible? To be considered a frontline essential worker in child care or schools, you must be in-person at your place of work, including staff who anticipate an imminent return to an in-person work setting. Staff who are 65 and older are already eligible to receive vaccine.
